<b>Aims</b> (purpose)	<p>To provide an understanding of a drivers responsibilities under specific legislation and to implement the safest course of action in emergency situations.</p> <p>To help companies comply with their legal requirements under the Management of Health &amp; Safety at Work Regulations 1999 to carry out risk assessments and implement controls concerning ‘reasonably foreseeable’ risks, including training of employees in dealing with emergencies whilst driving ‘out on the road’.</p>	
<b>Objectives</b> (Intended outcomes)	<p>On completion of training delegates should demonstrate an understanding of :-</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Their responsibilities under Common Law and specific legislation towards their passengers and other road users</li> <li>Dealing with a variety of emergency situations that could be encountered during the course of a drivers working day</li> <li>Contacting and assisting the emergency services</li> <li>What to do if a fire breaks out or if a vehicle evacuation of passengers is needed through any other incident</li> <li>Practical experience through carrying out vehicle evacuation exercises, including mock fire evacuations.</li> </ul>	
<b>Who is the training intended for?</b>	Vocational licence holders – PCV drivers who have to show attendance at driver CPC training sessions for the periodic training element of the EU training directive 2003/59
